History of Titles

- Titles are a way of *logically* organizing U.S. Code.
- History:
 - Until the early 1900s U.S. Statutes were disorganized
 - Held in many volumes of the "Statutes at Large."
 - In 1926 Congress created "U.S. Code of Congress."
 - Main edition every six years supplements annually.
 - The Code is divided into 54 Titles.
 - Deals with broad, logically organized areas of legislation.
 - A complex statute may have provisions that fall into many areas of the Code.

- 3 new additional Titles are proposed.



- Titles are "Authorities" set by Statute/US Code
- Titles define Roles/Missions of USG Organizations
- US Code/Titles contain "Acts of Congress"
 - Public Law
- There are other authorities
 - Executive Orders
 - Rules promulgated by the Courts
 - Statuses considered temporary (NDAA as example)
