History of Titles

- Titles are a way of <u>logically</u> organizing U.S. Code.
- History:
 - Until the early 1900s U.S. Statutes were disorganized
 - In 1926 Congress created "U.S. Code of Congress."
 - The Code is divided into 53 Titles.
 - Deals with broad, logically organized areas of legislation.
 - A complex statute may have provisions that fall into many areas of the Code.
 - 3 new additional Titles are proposed.





Take Aways

- Titles are "Authorities" set by Statute/US Code
- Titles define Roles/Missions of USG Organizations
- US Code/Titles contain "Acts of Congress"
 - Public Law

 - Statuses considered temporary (NDAA as example)
